

Living Wage

Committed to fair compensation for all employees and contractors

HIGHLIGHTS

- All Emory employees receive an hourly wage above the current federal poverty level, and most receive above the local living wage of \$15.45 per hour.
- All Emory employees receive a benefits package that includes medical benefits, basic life insurance, 403(b) retirement, and eligibility for a free sustainable commute transit pass.
- Emory's entry level wage is above \$11.87, which is the current federal poverty level expressed as an hourly rate.

BENEFITS

- As of 2017, 89% of employees, including regular full-time, regular part-time, and temporary workers, received a living wage.

HOW IT WORKS

- \$15.45 is the local living wage for Emory area employees with a family of four, according to the MIT Living Wage Calculator.
