HIGHLIGHTS

- The RCE Greater Atlanta is a diverse network of local stakeholders committed to advancing and teaching the <u>United Nations Sustainable</u> <u>Development Goals (SDGs</u>) at local and regional scales.
- The RCE Greater Atlanta was officially recognized by the **United Nations University** in 2017 and is one of 168 RCE networks in the world.
- The SDGs are an inherent part of **Emory's 2025 Sustainability Vision**. Emory's sustainability goals, as described in the Vision, contribute to at least twelve SDGs.

- engenders a culture of learning and continuous improvement, providing opportunities for students of all ages to contribute to these efforts and shape new ones;
- creates opportunity for Emory to align its sustainability and social justice goals with those of the United Nations.


The Greater Atlanta RCE will focus on the following primary SDGs:

- Launched Environmental Justice Academy and Youth Network SDG training program with a \$40,000 grant from Turner Foundation
- Guided by leadership from 7 higher education institutions, Youth Network held monthly volunteer events and quarterly meetings and engaged students in crosscampus sustainability projects
