

What is sustainability for Emory?

How do events fit into this?

- Enterprise-wide goals
 - All university **events will be zero municipal landfill waste** by 2025.
 - All university functions will be **plastic bottle free** to the extent possible by 2025.
 - Expand sustainable and local food purchases in catered events for all units by 2025.
 - On academic campuses, divert 95% of construction and nonconstruction waste (except regulated lab and medical waste) from municipal landfills.
 - Reduce Emory's total greenhouse gas emissions by 45% by 2030 and achieve net zero emissions by 2050, using 2010 levels as baseline.

ZERO LANDFILL WASTE: For our event, we agree to . . .

Eliminate polystyrene (Styrofoam).

✓ Event planner will work with vendors and event team to ensure Styrofoam will not be used in any way and that compostable or recyclable alternatives are available.



Polystyrene is not accepted in Emory's recycling stream, meaning it ends up in landfills that negatively impact the property values and quality of life of local communities, and release greenhouse gases. Polystyrene is a petroleumbased plastic, making it resource intensive and taking hundreds of years to biodegrade (Earth Resource).

Make recycling and composting bins available throughout the event space.

✓ Event planner will ensure event space already has adequate recycling and composting bins and, if not, contact Emory Campus Services Special Events to coordinate delivery and setup of recycling and composting bins.




Every year, Americans throw away enough paper and plastic cups, forks, and spoons to circle the equator 300 times (<u>Earth911</u>). Keeping waste out of trash cans helps Emory get closer to its goal of diverting 65% of waste from the landfill by 2015.

Order no additional trash cans for the event. Hide, cover, or label existing trash cans to be repurposed as rec<mark>ycling or</mark> composting bins. Clearly label recycling and composting bins and place in locations where they will be easily used.

- Event planner will indicate through a work order to <u>Emory Campus Services Special Events</u> not to deliver trash cans with recycling or composting bins. He/she will plan the event space accordingly to assure that trash cans are out of sight and recycling/composting stations conveniently placed.
 - Through Emory's expanded recycling and composting capacity, the need for trash cans is virtually eliminated (except for Styrofoam). Studies have shown that in institutional settings, the simple act of placing recycling bins in convenient locations greatly increases the amount recycled (Ludwig et al., 1998).

Emory prohibits the use of Styrofoam packaging or serviceware with any food delivery or at any oncampus event. In order to be listed on Emory Express, caterers are required to comply with this policy.

. If any Emory Express caterer delivers an order or completes an on-campus event with Styrofoam packaging, please contact America To Go Customer Service.



Zero Waste Designations

America to Go has added a Zero Landfill Waste filter under Cuisines and an icon (as seen on left) for restaurants and caterers that:

- Utilize 100% compostable packaging and serviceware for food deliveries and catered events. Compostable packaging and serviceware includes paper or plant-based products;
- Ensure all other catering items are recyclable in Emory's recycling stream; and
- Ensure all boxed meals comply with the above requirements, including eliminating the use of individual condiment packets.



Sustainable events should include meat-free items and options for gluten avoidance. Users can now utilize the Items search bar to search across menus to find the following on caterer's menus:

- Vegetarian
- Vegan
- Gluten-free

- Fresh brewed iced tea & iced water display







LANDFILL

NOTHING goes here except food-grade Styrofoam.

Please Recycle.

COMPOST

All food, food-soiled paper, napkins, paper food or beverage containers, biodegradable serviceware

PLASTICS & METALS

Metal cans, foil, plastic bottles, snack wrappers, plastic bags & wrap, most office supplies

MIXED PAPER

Newspapers, magazines, folders, colored paper, small cardboard, paperboard materials

WHITE PAPER

Copy and printer paper ONLY
