ZERO WASTE AMBASSADORS (ZWAs)

The ZWA program is a vital part of Emory's initiative to reduce and divert landfill waste. As a ZWA, you will serve as a peer-to-peer educator on proper waste management and reduction. This year, ZWAs will use a hybrid of virtual and in-person methods to conduct outreach and education. Zero Waste Ambassadors engage with the community by co-leading monthly "trash talks," contributing to OSI blog posts, leading waste training sessions, and educating other groups/communities which they are part of about Emory's zero landfill waste initiative.

EMORY EDUCATIONAL GARDENS PROJECT

The Educational Gardens Project (EEGP) is a sustainable food initiative that strengthens food security and teaches volunteers about growing their own food. Volunteers help with garden maintenance activities such as weeding, watering, planting, and harvesting. All members of the Emory community are invited to volunteer at weekly open workdays, which are one hour long. No prior gardening experience is necessary!

OSI INTERNSHIPS & FELLOWSHIPS

Emory's Office of Sustainability Initiatives (OSI) hires undergraduates, graduate students, Federal Work-Study (FWS) students, and Rollins Earn and Learn (REAL) program participants as interns. Interns conduct research, benchmarking, communications, and outreach in all areas of sustainability. OSI recently launched its post-graduate Fellows program with one Climate Solutions Fellow and two Sustainability & Social Justice Programs Fellows. These are entry-level positions, especially for recent graduates from historically marginalized and underserved populations.

GENERAL SUSTAINABILITY & SOCIAL JUSTICE INCENTIVES FUND

The General Sustainability & Social Justice Fund supports research, campus-based projects, and the development of new rituals that promote sustainability and social justice at Emory. Grants for up to \$3000 are awarded each fall. All Emory faculty, staff, and students are eligible to apply. Projects that are centered on the social justice facets of sustainability are especially encouraged to apply.

A past campaign worked to convince Emory to commit to using 100% renewable electricity. The goal of this campaign has now shifted to encourage President Fenves to declare a climate emergency. SLOW FOOD EMORY

We are passionate about increasing access to fresh, healthy food while reducing food waste. Our main initiative is our weekly produce gathering and cooking: we go to a farmers market to collect their surplus produce, then take it to be cooked at 1) Nicholas House, a shelter for families experiencing homelessness, 2) Hope Lodge, a free place to stay for cancer patients actively receiving treatment, or 3) Bread Coffeehouse, at which we prepare packaged meals for open-access Free 99 Fridges. We also host food-related events through the year, including woodfire pizza

making and cooking demos. We welcome anyone who is interested in food, cooking, sustainability, nutrition, volunteering, or interacting further with the Atlanta community!



EMORY FARMERS MARKET

The Emory Farmers Market connects seasonal, local food to the Emory community. The farmers market takes place every Tuesday from 11:00am-2:00pm on McDonough Plaza. Shop for groceries, lunch, snacks, drinks, and handcrafted goods from one of our 18 local vendors. Engage with small-scale producers, support the local economy, and promote a more sustainable food system while enjoying delicious, fresh food. Students can use Eagle and Dooley Dollars.





EMORY DINING

Learn more Emory Dining strives to support sustainable, local food systems. Almost 40% of the food served at Emory Dining locations are locally and/or sustainably sourced. Food waste is reduced by partnering with Emory Food Chain, a student group that recovers food and donates it to local food banks.



Emory's WaterHub is a water recycling system that uses eco-engineering processes to clean wastewater for future non-potable uses like flushing toilets. The WaterHub is capable of recycling up to 400,000 gallons of water each day-nearly 40% of Emory's total campus water needs.

4+1 Programs

- 4+1 BS/MPH with Laney Graduate School: Undergraduate ENVS majors can complete a BS in the College and an MS at Laney in 5 years. The MS curriculum is anchored in intensive research and the building of practical quantitative skills.
- 4+1 BS/EH MPH with Rollins School of Public Health: Undergraduate students can complete a BS and a Master of Public Health in Environmental Health in 5 years. This track adopts an interdisciplinary approach and allows students to tailor their degree to their specific interest area, such as climate change, air pollution, or policy.
