Position Description

Emory's Office of Sustainability Initiatives (OSI) is seeking qualified students to participate in our student internship program. Last year, Emory University committed to collectively pursuing the 2025
Strategic Plan goal of diverting 95% of Emory's waste from the municipal landfill.

As a part of the Zero-Landfill Waste Intern to assist OSI staff with communicating about the new Waste Management Policy, the waste bin overhaul, and the purpose and implications of conscientious waste management at Emory.

Applicants can expect to coordinate ongoing tabling events and signage rotations across campus, to recruit volunteers to assist with outreach efforts, to draft and help finalize communications materials, to act as a point of contact and a resource for the Zero Waste Ambassadors, to seek creative new means of communicating about the new waste management system, to present about the waste program to campus and community groups, and to help the OSI and campus partners plan for waste outreach and education in the Fall of 2019. The intern can also expect to support other OSI activities, such as tabling at campus events, conducting benchmark research, and writing articles about the OSI's work. OSI does not have extra office space for students, so work is done remotely with regular meetings with staff to discuss projects.

Interns are expected to work up to 10 hours per week, depending on OSI's needs and the intern's availability. This fall, this internship will be conducted in a hybrid format – in-person and remote.

Desired Qualifications

- Strong initiative, task-orientation, and attention to detail
- Talent for communicating through email and in-person to campus students, faculty and staff
- Interest in and understanding of principles of sustainability and environmental stewardship
- Comfort working independently with regular check-ins on activity and progress
- Talent for relationship building, one-on-one outreach and education, and process followthrough
- Experience managing volunteers is desired but not required

Eligibility

All currently-enrolled undergraduate and graduate students may apply. All majors are welcome, but those seeking experience in a field related to sustainability are preferred. During the Summer, interns are asked to work about 20 hours per week, based upon OSI's needs and the intern's availability.
