Position Description

Emory's Office of Sustainability is seeking an intern to work on the Farmers Market program. This will entail a variety of tasks that may include but are not limited to:

- Attending Emory Farmers Market to assist the market managers every Tuesday (January - April).
- Attending general intern meetings
- Drafting creative outreach & educational materials for program implementation, including physical and digital marketing about the Farmers Market
- Managing the Emory Farmers Market social media accounts and keeping information updated
- Coordinating community-building events and hosting educational program monthly under the supervision of the Sustainability & Social Justice Fellow
- Routinely checking Google Forms for educational tabling applications from student or community organizations

Interns are expected to work up to 20 hours per week, depending on OSI's needs and the intern's availability. This spring, this internship will be conducted in a hybrid format – in-person and remote. Weekly intern meetings alternate between the two formats. Interns are expected to attend most if not all meetings and provide advance notice if they are not able to attend.

Desired Qualifications

- Ability to attend most of the Farmers Markets every Tuesday from 11 AM-2 PM
- Comfortable working with different market co-managers and vendors
- Strong writing skills with experience writing research reports, articles, blogs
- Ability to communicate well with other Emory departments
- Interest in sustainable food and understanding of principles of sustainability and environmental stewardship
