#### The Funds:

Green Offices and Green Labs Incentives Funds: submit to <a href="mailto:qreenoffices@emory.edu">qreenoffices@emory.edu</a> or <a href="mailto:qreenlabs@emory.edu">qreenlabs@emory.edu</a> respectively

The Green Offices and Green Labs Incentives Funds support certified workspaces participating in the <u>Green Offices</u> and <u>Green Labs</u> at Emory Programs by funding sustainable processes and procedures in Emory's workspaces. Creative proposals are welcomed for initiatives that seek new knowledge, support new behavior patterns, and make sustainable practices feasible. **Grants may be awarded up to** \$5,000.

Faculty, staff, and students from <u>certified</u> workspaces or laboratories in Emory University and Emory Healthcare are eligible to apply for the Green Offices and Green Labs Incentives Funds. Funds may be used for supplies, equipment, and materials necessary to implement an item on the Green Offices or Green Labs checklist, or a sustainability innovation. Grant recipients must provide a brief written report at the conclusion of the project, including documentation of the resulting changes utilizing photographs, written material, data, and other tools appropriate for documentation.

## General Sustainability & Social Justice Incentives Fund: submit to emorysustainability@emory.edu

The Office of Sustainability Initiatives provides Incentives Fund grants to support research, campus-based projects, and the development of new rituals that promote sustainability on Emory's Atlanta and Oxford campuses and in Emory's healthcare spaces. Creative proposals that seek new knowledge, support new behavior patterns, and foster cultural change are welcomed. Faculty, staff and students from Emory University and Emory Healthcare are eligible to apply. **Projects that are centered** 





on the social justice facets of sustainability or highlight the social justice impacts of their project or research are encouraged to apply.

**Up to \$3,000** is available for projects supporting General Sustainability and Social Justice. Funds may be used for supplies, materials, publicity, and other approved costs supporting projects, research, and rituals that promote sustainable ideas.

Requests for funding for food purchases, honoraria, publishing fees, conference fees, and travel expenses are rarely approved by Incentives Fund Committees.

#### **Selection:**

The selection committee composed of staff, faculty, and students will assess grant proposals based on the following criteria:

- Relevance of the project to the <u>Green Offices</u> or <u>Green Labs</u> programs, <u>Emory's 2025 Sustainability Vision</u>, and/or <u>the United Nations Sustainable</u> <u>Development Goals</u>.
- 2. Clarity and feasibility of the proposal, including clear goals and objectives
- 3. Sustained impact and reach of the proposed project
- 4. Innovation and creativity to address complex sustainability-related challenges
- 5. Relevant skills and experience of project personnel

Outdoor Emory strives to follow the "Leave No Trace" principle when leading trips on and off Emory's campus. This project would fund the purchase of reusable water bottles (labeled with the OSI logo) and camping dishware sets that we could provide to trip participants who sign up for trips with Outdoor Emory. This would eliminate plastic water bottles and plastic plates and silverware from being purchased to bring onto a trip and potentially left in nature. The bottles with the OSI and Outdoor Emory Logo would also provide an opportunity for marketing of both groups on campus.

<u>Project Timeline</u>: Project teams will be notified by early November about funding of their proposals. All projects must be completed by Friday, July 28, 2023. With these parameters in mind, please provide a detailed timeline for project implementation and completion.

Starting in November, I will begin working with the VP of our Involvement Committee in order to design, order and purchase the water bottles. The bottles and dishware should take a few weeks to arrive. We will then document them into our inventory and begin distributing as trips go out! We would hope to start giving out the bottles by second semester.
